School Uniform & Belongings

It was a pleasure to see how smart our pupils looked when they returned to school this term. Kitting your child(ren) out with school uniform and PE kit can be expensive and with nearly 400 children wearing the same clothes, it can be hard to reunite pupils with their belongings if they lose them. **Please may we ask that all uniform and belongings are named.** Names can be written on clothing labels & inside lunch boxes etc or printed name labels can be ordered from various companies. We end up with a lot of lost property at the end of each term - sometimes complete sets of clothes including shoes and coats! If your child loses anything, please encourage them to look for it - lost property is placed in the deep drawers outside the hall.

Free School Meals - Don't forget to apply!

All children in EYFS and Key Stage 1 are automatically entitled to a free school meal. When your child moves into Year 3, this no longer applies. However, if you receive certain benefits then you can apply for free school meals to continue. Road Safety

Please can we ask for everyone's help to keep our pupils safe.

We are becoming increasingly concerned for the safety of our pupils at the start and the end of the day. Some parents are putting pupils, parents & other drivers at risk as they are stopping right outside school to drop their children off or parking dangerously on the zig-zag lines whilst they collect their child. We have seen parents park so far on the pavement that pedestrians have been forced to walk in the road; we have seen parents and taxi drivers pull away and drive whilst still half on the pavement; we have seen parents and taxi drivers stop right outside the school gate to drop off, causing other drivers to have to stop or go round them which is not easy on this busy hill.

Please may we remind you ...

- No vehicle should stop or park on the yellow zig-zag lines (on either side of the road) outside school
- No vehicle should be driving whilst mounted on the pavement
- Please do not pull into/ reverse out of the drive way in front of the school gates as children (and parents) are walking up and down
- The lower car park is used by our youngest children and their parents at drop off and collection time therefore no cars are permitted at this time (the only exception to this is for a pupil with a wheelchair).
- Parents walking through the lower car park should supervise their children
- Some of our pupils are very small and are not always visible above car windscreens or car blind spots.

Considerate Parking

Please may we ask on behalf of the residents who live in Highbridge Road, opposite our school, that you do not park outside their homes or block access to their road.

We know our school site is in a tricky position but please help to keep all of our pupils - your children and their friends - safe, by driving and parking safely.

What is the Asda cashpot for Schools?



Between 2nd September and 30th November 2024 – every time you shop with Asda using your Asda Rewards app, Asda will donate 0.5% of the value of your shop to your chosen Primary school.

Pupil Leadership Teams

In the first couple of weeks of the new school year, the pupils have been busy volunteering and voting for new pupil leaders for the various leadership teams we have at Netherton CofE.

In keeping with our vision and values, we offer our pupils a wide range of opportunities to enable them to develop as well-rounded individuals.

We have established a variety of pupil leadership teams, whose roles are constantly developing and who are involved in different projects and activities, but all of them have the shared aim of helping leaders to develop and improve our school, for all our pupils. By having pupil representatives on a range of leadership teams, all our pupils have a voice.



Pupils have the opportunity to volunteer for a number of leadership opportunities, with representatives from all year groups, 1 - 6.

Different teams have different selection processes, so our children gain experience of applying for, being nominated for, or being chosen for roles. With a number of roles being voted for by their peers, the children learn about one of the British Values - Democracy, experiencing an election.

Head Boys & Head Girls

The Head Boys and Girls of the school are responsible for supporting the Leadership Team, in being ambassadors for the school. They are the ultimate role models for all other pupils in the school.

As ambassadors for the school, they have a number of roles and responsibilities including greeting visitors and ensuring that the views of all pupils are represented and listened to.

Selecting our Head Boy & Head Girl

Thirty pupils wished to be considered for the role this year. They each wrote a letter to the Head Teacher, outlining why they would like to be Head Boy/Girl and why they would be good at the role.

As well as considering their application letter, Mrs Harvey consults the staff team and considers the pupil's attitude and conduct throughout their time at school, before speaking to each of them.

School Council
