
Achievements to date:

- All children in school participated in 2 hours of PE each week.
- An additional rugby coach was sourced from Stourbridge Rugby Club to work with children in Years 5 and 6 and also the gifted and talented children across Years 4 and 5.
- After school provision (when allowed), continued with a number of clubs being run by the PE lead and the PE specialist for children from Years 1 – 6. These were all full.
- The PE specialist and PE lead continued to Team Teach with staff to enable high quality lessons and pupil engagement.
- The Chance to Shine Cricket programme was carried out in Years 1, 3 and 5. Following this a Dynamo and All Stars Club was set up in partnership with Netherton Cricket Club. 62 children regularly attended. Following this PE lead was awarded school of the year by Worcester Cricket Club.
- Planning has been evaluated ready for improvements to be made to bring this up to date.
- New PE kit has become well established in school with a high percentage of the children wearing it with pride.
- We were able to hold our annual Sports Day with all children from Reception to Year 6 taking part.
- Children in Year 5 were taken to Lords to take part in a cricket skills day
- Children entered and won cricket competitions and athletics.
- Children entered rugby, multi-skills, 4 cricket competitions, athletics, girls football, netball and cross country.
- Performed at Stourbridge town hall, Windsor High School and Halesowen town centre with the dance troop

Areas for development;

- Planning for the 3 main areas of PE has been looked at and reviewed. The plan is for the PE lead and the PE specialist to re-write any areas that need to be improved to make sure children are being challenged appropriately.
- New Sports leaders to be selected to carry out activities at lunch time with other children across the school to help increase activity amongst all children.
- More opportunities for intra school competitions to be created as part of PE lessons to increase children's understanding of competitive sport
- Continue to run the Team Teach programme with all staff to improve confidence and teacher understanding
- Employ and embed a new Sports Mentor
- Increase number of sporting after school clubs on offer
- Enter both girls and boys football leagues
- Dance provision needs to be investigated and a new provider sourced
